

Examination Day Sickness Procedure

If a student is too ill to sit a public exam, they must

Contact the School Immediately on the day of the exam on TEL: 01279 654901

The school will then guide the student and may apply for Special Consideration on their behalf, which may involve getting medical evidence from a GP or specialist to support the application.

The specific process and requirements can vary, so it is essential to follow the guidance provided by the school and the exam board.

Before the exam

- **Contact the school immediately:** Inform the school as soon as possible on the morning of the exam, before it starts.
- Seek medical advice: See a doctor to get an assessment and, if possible, a medical certificate or letter, especially if it's a serious illness. Some exam boards may not require a specific medical certificate, but it is best to have one if possible.

On the day of the exam

- Inform an invigilator immediately: If the illness occurs during the exam, inform an invigilator straight away. They will provide guidance and arrange for you to be escorted from the exam room.
- **Inform the school:** Contact the school to let them know you are unwell and will not be taking the exam.

After the exam

- Follow the school's instructions: The school will provide instructions on what to do next.
- **Submit evidence:** You will need to provide evidence, such as a doctor's note, to support an application for special consideration or a similar process.
- Apply for special consideration: The school will likely handle the application for special
 consideration, which may result in a grade being estimated based on performance in other
 papers.

Note: Requirements can vary between exam boards and institutions, so always follow the specific instructions given by your school or college and the exam board.
