Covid: Reporting Results

With reference to the latest COVID guidance update for schools on LFD and PCR testing. Please be aware that as from the 17th January 2022 if your child does not have symptoms of COVID but tests positive on a LFD test there are currently no requirements to take a PCR test to confirm the result, they must self-isolate immediately this day is known as day ZERO. If your child does have symptoms of COVID a PCR test is required, once the result is known please inform the school that a PCR test has been taken along with the date of the test. FIREBORN! An author talks about her new book- have you read it yet?





Composer of the Month: January Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart



Born in Salzburg, in the Holy Roman Empire, Mozart showed prodigious ability playfrom his earliest childhood ing keyboard and violin, he began com-

posing from the age of five and performed before European royalty, embarking on a grand tour and then three trips to Italy. At 17, Mozart was engaged as a musician at the Salzburg court but grew restless and travelled in search of a better position.

While visiting Vienna in 1781, he was dismissed from his Salzburg position. He chose to stay in Vienna, where he achieved fame but little financial security. During his final years in Vienna, he composed many of his best-known symphonies, concertos, and operas, and portions of the Requiem, which was largely unfinished at the time of his early death at the age of 35. The circumstances of his death are largely uncertain, and have thus been much mythologized ..

Geography Fieldwork



The word Catholics across the globe are thinking about this year is undoubtedly the word "synod." Last year, Pope Francis launched a two-year Universal Synod, taking place in every Catholic diocese around the world.

With the theme of "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission", this process calls on all of us think, pray, and discuss; to discern what the Holy Spirit is telling us, what kind of Church God is calling us to be, and how we can better reach out to the margins, engage with all people and groups in our society, so we can continue our journey of faith together.





Help us to respond to the challenges of our times in new ways to bring your love to all our sisters and brothers. We make this prayer through Jesus Christ Our Lord.


