Well done to everyone who participated and special thanks to Mrs Gohra-Grzywacz for the amazing cookies!





This week we took our year 8 and 10 football teams to play against Leventhorpe School. As a reward for the pupils excellent commitment to training, we took large squads to both these games.






The prayer is:

Saint in Focus: St. Josephine Bakhita

Patron Saint of 'B' House



Josephine was born in 1869 in the village of Olgossa, in the Darfur region of Sudan, Africa, growing up in a prosperous home, having a happy childhood. At the age of 8, Josephine was kidnapped by Arab slave traders, and made to walk 600 miles to a slave market, where she was sold as a slave. After many years of torture and suffering as a slave, in her early 20's, Josephine was declared free and was baptised. She chose to become a nun, spending 45 years working as a cook and doorkeeper for the convent and preparing young nuns for their missionary work in Africa. Before she died a student had once asked her "What would you do if you were to meet you captors?". She said "If I were to meet those who kidnapped me, and even those who tortured me, I would kneel and kiss their hands. For, if these things had not happened, I would not have been a Christian and a religious today". Sr. Josephine was regarded as a saint by the people of Schio in northern Italy, because of her constant smile, her friendliness and helpfulness. Even in later life, as old age and sickness confined her to a wheelchair she kept her cheerfulness.

"The whole of my life has been God's gift." - St. Josephine Bakhita

Given the difficulties and challenges of her life, how could St Josephine make such a declaration? How could she view her life as a gift? Perhaps, it is similar to the way Christians view the events of the suffering and death of Jesus – through the lens of the resurrection and through the great redemption He won for us. The challenge is for us to find that 'lens of faith', to be able to view our

lives and our histories and discover the mysterious plan of God in our lives. Having discovered our life as a gift, can we be courageous and generous in offering it in service of others?

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


