On Monday, we held our inaugural 'Oracy Day'. Miss Keane, English Teacher and Literacy Coordinator led the staff training and provided resources so that every teacher—regardless of the subject they were teaching—was able to focus on this in lessons on the day.



Students were asked to choose targets to help them improve their speaking and listening skills in form time and teachers planned inspirational lessons that explicitly taught oracy skills (the art of speaking and listening). Students were able to practise these throughout the day.

There was a real buzz around the school as staff and students embraced the opportunity to focus on improving the quality of talk.

Oracy is an important skill to develop in the classroom as it enables students to participate in deep learning activities and exchange ideas, explore new areas and challenge assumptions. It really develops confidence in the students as they learn



to understand the power of being an effective communicator. This in turn ensures students become better learners across the curriculum and will help in future employability.

Students were challenged to use 'PV LEGS':

Poise—head up, shoulders back, feet still

Voice—Pronounce words at a good volume

Life—passion, emotion, tone, pitch, emphasis

Eye contact—connect visually

<u>Gestures</u>—facial expression, hand emphasis

<u>Speed</u>—don't rush, use pauses for effect
