Dear Parents and Students.

Miss McHugh and I will alternate the writing of these weekly Headline updates, and this week it is my turn to summarise the week and give some key messages. We would like to thank parents, staff and students for their messages of support as we embark upon our new role, as part of the St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Academy Trust.

As I write this article after a week of beautiful sunshine and heat, the heavens have opened, and the rain is pouring down-a sign that autumn in on the way and the remnants of summer that we have experienced this week are to be enjoyed while they last!

It's been a busy and energising week at are already feeling like part of the famschool. We facilitated the LFD testing for over approximately 750 students on Monday, and have now concluded the second tests for all students on site. Thanks must go to Mrs Woskett (First Aid) and the admin team for arranging these so effectively. It is reassuring to know that—at the time of the test everyone remaining on site was tested negative and we could start the year in confidence. It remains to be seen just how the rise in infection numbers will play out, but -as always-we will follow the advice of the professionals at Public Health and put into action the recommendations whilst maintaining our Covidcontrol measures at school. On that note, it is important that each student takes an LFD test at home each Wednesday and Sunday and informs the school if there is a positive result (and Public Health guidance to take a PCR test).

We have also welcomed a number of new staff over the last two weeks. Later on in these Headlines, you will meet three new leaders to the school who introduce themselves and their roles. In coming Headlines, we will introduce our other new staff. A warm 'St. Mary's Welcome' has been extended to all, and they


Student Planner App Update and Information

Chaplaincy News: Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Our Patron Saint

"Mary was born to be the mother of the Saviour of the world, the spiritual mother of all men, and the holiest of God's creatures. Because of her Son's infinite merits, she was conceived and born immaculate and full of grace. Through her, Queen of heaven and of earth, all grace is given to men. Through her, by the will of the Trinity, the unbelieving receive the gift of faith; the afflicted are tendered the works of mercy; and the members of Christ grow in likeness of their Head. In Mary all human nature is exalted."



Excerpt from The Holyday Book by Fr. Francis Weiser, SJ

Reading: Matthew 1:18-23

¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: his mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

²⁰ But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.'

²² All this took place to fulfil what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³ 'The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel' (which means 'God with us').

Pause to think about your own needs and for any situations in our world today that need our prayers. We turn to Mary, our Mother and Mother of the Church, and pray together:

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thine intercession was left unaided.

Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother; to thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful.

O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me.
