Neurologist

Neurologists diagnose, treat and manage patients with diseases, disorders or problems linked to their brains. Neurologists work in Emergency situations and ongoing treatments with patients.

Average Salary: £40,000 – 75,000

Do you need a Degree? Yes. To become a Neurologist, you would first need a Medical Degree which will take a minimum of 5 years. You would then complete 2 years of foundation training in UK hospitals.

To become fully qualified to the highest level, this would take a minimum of an additional 7 years
