Why This Matters

Student leadership is integral to nurturing our students who embody the values of faith, service, and community. By engaging in student leadership roles, students not only develop essential skills such as communication, empathy, and responsibility but also deepen their understanding of servant leadership—a concept rooted in the teachings of Jesus Christ. This approach encourages students to lead by example, prioritising the needs of others and fostering a supportive school environment.

Moreover, student leaders often play a pivotal role in organising liturgical events, promoting social justice initiatives, and mentoring younger peers, thereby reinforcing the school's Catholic ethos and mission. Through these experiences, students are prepared to become compassionate leaders who are committed to making positive contributions both within and beyond their school communities.

What do the Virtues Mean?

Humility means being confident in your abilities but not showing off. It's about being open to learning from others and putting others before yourself.

Being **faith-filled** means trusting in God and trying to live like Jesus. It means praying, believing, and letting your faith guide how you treat others.

A **learned** person loves discovering new things and wants to grow in knowledge. It means listening carefully, asking questions, and using what you learn to make good choices.

Determination means never giving up, even when things are hard. It's about trying your best and keeping a positive attitude when facing challenges.

Kindness is showing care and respect to everyone, no matter who they are. It means using your words and actions to make others feel safe and valued.

Service means using your time and talents to help others. It's about doing good things without expecting anything in return.

Courage means doing the right thing, even when you're scared or unsure. It's about standing up for others and trying your best in difficult situations.

Charity is showing love through giving and helping those in need. It can mean sharing your time, attention, or resources with others.

Being **responsible** means taking care of your work, actions, and choices. It's about being trustworthy and doing what's expected of you.

Integrity means being honest and doing the right thing, even when no one is watching. It's about staying true to your values and keeping your promises.

Justice means wanting fairness for everyone. It's about standing up for what is right and treating people equally.

Curiosity means wanting to learn more about the world around you. It's about asking questions and exploring new ideas with enthusiasm.

Roles and Responsibilities:

- To be a role model to students in the school in terms of attitude, attendance, punctuality and dress.
- To represent the school at all major school events, for example: Open Evening, Sixth Form Open Evening, etc.
- To organise other students to attend and support major school events (e.g. Parents Evenings).
- Working closely with the School Chaplain to assist with the organisation of and participate in all Masses, Liturgies and church services during the year. In addition to this, organise Prefects to participate.
- To liaise with the Director of Sixth Form and the Year 13 Sixth Form Manager with regards to the Prefect system and the organisation of duties.
- To perform a variety of duties around the school. The duties may take place before school, breaktime and lunchtime in the canteen, library and around the school site.
- To liaise with Senior Prefect team to ensure that the Prefect system within the Sixth Form is organised efficiently.
- To support the Sixth Form Team with the delivery of the Year 13 Leavers Prom and other leavers memorabilia (e.g. Leavers hoodies).
- To support the school in upholding high standards amongst the student body, both in the Sixth Form Study Centre and also the wider school (e.g. litter, dress code, etc.)
- To oversee events led by Year 12s during the school “Charity Week” to raise money for a specified charity. This is a role which Head Pupils, Deputy Head Pupils and Senior Prefects are all responsible for.
