### Queen Elizabeth II RIP

Sunday's Gospel reading was quite challenging. It recounted an occasion when Jesus was talking to the crowds, in very blunt terms about what it takes to be a follower of his:

'Anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.'

Taken literally, the language used in the passage could be very off-putting to the reader. However, we have to understand the underlying message of Jesus' address, rather than the literal meaning of his language. What he is saying is, if you want to be one of my followers, you must show



commitment and be consistent - don't treat it as a pick and mix menu of activities - and put him at the centre of your lives. I am sure we are all affected in one way or another by the news last night of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. It will surely be seen as a momentous event in our history. Amid the different reports and testimonials presented in the media, one constant theme stands out: that the Queen's strong Christian faith was at the centre of her life. Here was someone who

did put Christ at the centre. In a similar way, here at St Mary's we aim to make the 'Catholic life of the school' a central feature of our students' daily experience. This includes making opportunities for our students to experience faith in action. One important example of that is the opportunity for prayer each day and a great tradition at St Mary's, in particular, is the Friday morning Examen: an opportunity for staff and students to become aware of God's presence, reflect on the events of the week and give thanks, and pray for the future. Today we prayed especially for the Queen and the happy repose of her soul.




# **Curriculum Update**

#### Welcome back to lessons

I hope that the first week of lessons have been exciting and rewarding, for students in all year groups. Year 7s are getting to know new teachers and used to moving across a large site. Years 10/12 have started new and exciting GCSE or A Level courses, and Years 11 and 13 begin to settle in with familiar subjects and teachers ready for a big examination year ahead.

#### Curriculum Focus: RE



Each subject area across the school has carefully planned the curriculum for the students as they travel through their 7-year St. Mary's journey. We focus this week on the RE curriculum, which all students in the school study through to GCSE and many choose in the Sixth Form as an A Level.

All Sixth Form students undertake a 'Core RE' component which helps students to think about social, global and moral, ethical issues. This develops their critical thinking and wider perspectives on the world.

#### Year 7 Language Preferences

All new students in Year 7 were asked on entry for their **preference** for the language to study in KS3. We can never guarantee this preference, but have used it to guide the timetable when it was being written; wherever possible this was taken into account. We have had some correspondence regarding changing the language allocation which is, at this stage, quite difficult to do and in most cases would involve changing a number of other class groups, including English, Drama, Art, Music, History, Geography and RE.

### **Literacy News**

#### KS3 Reading Challenge starting this term

The SMCS Reading Challenge Cup is a football-style reading league for all the AR groups in Years 7, 8 and 9.

The Accelerated Reader software tracks how many words each student reads when they **take and pass** a quiz. So the more books students read and quiz on, the higher their group will rise in the league. A cup is awarded to the top group at the end of the year, with incentive prizes for top readers at the end of each term. Last year's overall winners were AR group 7F, with over 11 million words quizzed on.



Individual readers also have the chance to earn a certificate and badge when they reach a million words.

Please encourage your children to read for 35 minutes each day, especially if they have got out of the habit over the summer break. It is important that they are reading material they love – fiction or non-fiction, magazine or graphic novel. Regular reading for pleasure increases students' performance across all subjects, and it's also great for their wellbeing during the busy start of term.

#### Book Buzz - a free book for every Year 7 student



## **Eligibility Criteria for Free School Meals**

**Dear Parents and Carers** 

Please can I take this opportunity to remind you of the eligibility criteria for Free School Meals.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- \* Income Support
- \* Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- \* Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- \* Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- \* the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- \* Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- \* Working Tax Credit run-on—paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- \* Universal Credit—if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)



Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they will remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they are in on 31 March 2023.

### **Geography News ~ Competition ~ A Level**




### A Level Global Sustainable Development Competition Winners announced
