The second assembly of the week offered me the opportunity to reflect on a life dedicated to serving our country - that of Queen Elizabeth II. Last Friday. the day following the death of The Queen, we prayed and held a period of silence to commemorate this significant event. This week in assemblies I led a reflection on Her life and the reaction of our nation to Her death. Of

greatest interest to me was The Queen's commitment to Her faith. In 2008 She is quoted as saying,

"I hope that, like me, you will be comforted by the example of Jesus of Nazareth who, often in circumstances of great adversity, managed to live an outgoing, unselfish and sacrificial life...He makes it clear that genuine human happiness and satisfaction lie more in giving than receiving; more in serving than in being served."

Here is a wonderful message for our students, as they reflect on their contribution to the St Mary's community and beyond.

Perhaps you are planning to travel to Westminster Hall to join the thousands of people paying their respects at The Queen's Lying in State? If so, I hope it goes smoothly and the wait time is manageable. However, I did urge the students to find some time to watch The



Queen's funeral ceremony, which will be televised on Monday. It is a rare event in anyone's lifetime and something that they will remember for years to come.

It is essential that any student identified as having a health care need has an up to date and accurate health care plan in place.







# Students Digital Planner ~ A Guide for Parents


# The Students Digital Planner should be used for sending messages to the school office or to a teacher.
