"Aspire not to have more, but to be more"

This week has been a particularly important time in the Church's calendar. On Tuesday we celebrated the feast of All Saints and Wednesday was the feast of All Souls.

"We are all called to be saints," Pope Francis told pilgrims at a General Audience in November 2014. "But," he said, "we must remember that holiness is a gift from God - not something we can achieve on our own ...however, the call to holiness is not just for bishops, priests or religious ... No. We are all called to become saints! So often, we are tempted to think that holiness is granted only to those who have the opportunity to break away from the ordinary tasks, to devote themselves to prayer. But it is not so! Some people think that holiness is closing your eyes and putting on a pious face... No! That is not holiness! Holiness is something greater, more profound that God gifts us. Indeed, it is by living with love and offering Christian witness in our daily tasks that we are called to become saints....Be holy by becoming a visible sign of God's love and His presence beside us...at home, on the streets, at work, at church, in the moment and with the state of life that you have, a door is opened on the road to sainthood. Do not be discouraged to travel this road. God gives you the grace to do so. And this is all that the Lord asks, that we are in communion with Him and serve others...

On the feast of All Saints were are presented in the Gospel reading of the sermon on the mount, when Jesus gave his guidance for a good way of life, in the beatitudes:

> 'How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Happy the gentle:

they shall have the earth for their heritage. Happy those who mourn: they shall be comforted. Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied. Happy the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them. Happy the pure in heart: they shall see God. Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God. Happy those who are persecuted in the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven. 'Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.'

The language of the beatitudes can be quite difficult to understand but the essence of these blessings is summed up in a famous quote from Saint Oscar Romero: 'Aspire not to have more but to be more.' That's a simple idea for our students to understand and to use as a guide to their lives.

On the feast of All Souls we remember those near and dear to us who have died and we pray that they may rest in peace. All students were engaged in a special time of prayer in their form groups on Wednesday, and they were able to write down the names of those close to them who have died, and who we will pray for during the month of November.

> Eternal rest, grant unto them, O Lord And let perpetual light shine upon them May they rest in peace <u>Amen</u>

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Crisis in Ukraine

Heavy fighting, shelling and air strikes across Ukraine have had devastating consequences for ordinary people. Over 5 million people have fled the country, and many more have had to leave their homes to escape the fighting. At Ukraine's borders with Poland, Romania, Hungary, Slovakia and Moldova, huge numbers of people are arriving with only what they can carry. In many places there are long waits to cross and scant facilities waiting for them on the other side, with temperatures dropping below freezing overnight.





In his words following the recitation of the Angelus prayer, Pope Francis said that on Tuesday 25 October he will go to Rome's Colosseum to pray for peace in Ukraine and in the world, together with representatives of the Christian Churches and Communities and world religions. The moment of prayer will take place in conjunction with the "Cry of Peace" meeting taking place these days.

As a school some of our families are directly affected by the war in Ukraine and we keep them and their families very much in our prayers that them, their loved ones and their homeland will see peace.

One of our Year 9 students has shared her exceptionally poignant poem with us.

I am Fine

It started when dad asked me if I wanted to go to school,

It was 7:49 am,

The wind and rain did not deter the dedicated Sixth Form Geographers from a day at the beach to complete some fieldwork.






Students investigated the different beach profiles, the impact of groynes on longshore drift and the types of waves. They even got to enjoy some free time for lunch. Great work everyone!

Mrs Johnson Teacher of Food & Nutrition




My name is Caron Johnson and I am a new member of the DT Department, teaching Food Preparation and Nutrition.

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School Attendance

At St Mary's we believe in the fundamental right of the student to be educated to his or her full potential and to participate fully in the life of the school community. High attendance rates have been highlighted as a significant factor in maintaining the quality of education provided in schools and parents must work with the school to ensure their child attends every day the school is open.

Requesting leave of absence:

We ask parents to only request leave of absence in exceptional circumstances and do so in advance via the Student App. Please book any medical appointments around the school day where possible. Parents must notify the school in advance of any pre-arranged absence or treatment. This should be within 48 hours of the appointment made and a copy of the appointment record should also be shared with the school when requesting absence so that this can be authorised.



In the event that a student's attendance is below the critical level of 90% without valid reasons, letter 1 will be sent home to highlight concerns. Should the child's attendance continue to fall and show no sign of improvement, letter 2 will be sent and the parents invited to school to complete a "Parenting Contract" with the school Attendance Officer. Your case will be referred to the Attendance Improvement Officer at County.

Please note that the Government guidance notes that if a parent does not engage with the support the school is offering to help the child attend school and access an education, and severe absence for unauthorised reasons continues, it is likely to constitute neglect.
