

'Spring Cleaning'

February half term always marks the halfway point of the school year. As we resume school this week, we begin the second half. In assemblies this week I used the analogy of a football manager's half time talk - that time for the team to reflect on its first half performance and plan for the next 45 minutes. In a similar way I asked students to reflect on the school year since September and to ask themselves how well they had performed: had they given their best efforts? Was everything going the way they had planned? Were there aspects of their participation in school life that could be improved. For those who may feel the first half had not gone as well as possible, I reassured them that there was plenty of time to make an improvement, and that the staff were here to help. This exercise in reflection linked nicely with my second theme: the beginning of Lent. In assemblies and our Ash Wednesday liturgies, we explored the meaning of this special season in the Church's year some 'spring cleaning' in preparation for the most important celebration in the Church's calendar: Easter. The traditional three themes were presented: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. I reminded students that these next 40 days are an opportunity to re-evaluate our relationship with God and how we are living out our faith in our school community. In order to help with prayer during Lent we have introduced 'SiLent' - a two minute silence at midday, each day at school throughout Lent. At this time we stop whatever we are doing and have time, individually, for prayer and reflection. During the next six weeks we have time to recommit to our values of love and respect, in order that we may all flourish.




World Book Day 2023

Year 10 Work Experience




Parents and Carers should this week have received a letter and Parent Guide for Work Experience this year which will be taking place Monday 10th July – Friday 14th July 2023.


