

Coronation Weekend - God Save the King!

This morning (Friday 5th) we held a coronation ceremony at St. Mary's with the whole-school in attendance to mark the occasion of King Charles III and Queen Consort, Camilla acceding to the throne as Head of State, not only for Great Britain, but also for the 54 countries of the Commonwealth across the world. It is an historic event for our society and one I know that many of you will be watching and celebrating with family and friends over the weekend. Luckily, this morning we avoided the downpour that happened not long after we left the tennis courts!

King Charles III has had many 'firsts' as he has waited to become King. He is the first British monarch to have gone to school, rather than be educated by a private tutor at Buckingham Palace. When he joined school for the first time, his Headteacher encouraged him to join the football team so he could play as an equal with his peers. He is also the first monarch to attend university – having read History and Archaeology at the University of Cambridge.

King Charles has shown himself to be a principled man, who puts others before himself and sees his role as one of service. This is a very Christian viewpoint and one we share through our values as a school of Love, Respect, Flourish. Some of his most important work is as the founder and patron of the 'Prince's Trust' since 1976, which has become the UK's leading youth charity. More recently he has become the patron of the International Rescue Committee, a global charity aiming to help refugees and those displaced by war, persecution and natural disaster.

King Charles will pledge to rule with justice and mercy and to serve God and all his subjects when he is crowned and anointed at the ceremony in Westminster Abbey tomorrow, 6th May.

Prayer for Christian Unity under the reign of King Charles III:

Lord God. In your power you provide for your people and rule over them in love. Grant your servant Charles the spirit of wisdom and government, that during his reign your church may be protected and Christian devotion may continue in peace; That so persevering in good works to the end, he may by your mercy enter into your everlasting kingdom; Through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God now and forever. Amen.

We are exceptionally proud of him and wish him every success.








Year 7 Sporting Achievement



Fosters 'Back to School' officially begins 2nd May 2023. We expect this period to be extremely busy and we are doing all we can to improve your experience when visiting or ordering.

Visiting Us

From Tuesday 2nd May to Friday 8th September, we will be operating a combined appointments and walk-in system. Priority will always be given to appointments – we will do our utmost to see you at your allocated time slot. We allow 30 minutes for a fully assisted uniform shop. Appointments

Please come into the building no more than 2-3 minutes ahead of your appointment time.

If you are late, we will do our best to serve you for the remainder of your 30 minute slot. If you are more than 15 minutes late, we will need to release your appointment and you will have to either re-book or queue for a walk-in spot.





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We will operate a queuing system for walk-in customers. Upon arrival, please take a numbered token. You will then be told the approximate wait time. Each walk-in customer will have a dedicated member of staff to assist them.


