


















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# **Rotary Club Young Chef Competition**



St. Mary's entered two teams in the annual Rotary Club of Bishop's Stortford Young Chef competition held at Birchwood School. The junior team consisted of Year 8 students Christiaan, Mateusz and David, and the Intermediate team of Rosie, Evie and Jessica were selected from Ms. Johnson's Year 10 GCSE class.

This annual event gives students vital experience in a range of key areas within the food, nutrition and preparation curriculum including independently planning a heathy meal, presentation of food and hygiene considerations.

This year seventeen teams from local schools entered and prizes are awarded to the winners in each category. Additionally, all fifty-one student chefs are individually observed and judged for the opportunity to represent the Bishop's Stortford area at the district competition and be awarded Young Chef of the year 2023.

Prior to the event students are required to plan, cost and practice their dishes so at the event they are able to prepare and present, as a team, a three-course healthy meal for two people costing no more than £22 served at the correct temperature within a cooking time of 90 minutes.



A prestigious panel of judges graded the teams on planning, healthy choices, use of equipment, hygiene, range of skills and taste.

The St. Mary's Junior team crafted a meal of asparagus soup with garlic croutons

served with asparagus wrapped in Parma ham, smoked haddock and lardon risotto served with parmesan crisp, meringue, fruit coulis seasonal fruits with mint and lemon sorbet. The team received high praise from the judges for their creative menu choices, flavour and teamwork.



After three hours of high intensity competition Rosie, Evie and Jessica were announced winners of the Intermediate category. Their pan-roasted duck breast served in a lettuce boat with pickled cucumber, spring onion and plum sauce, prawn and bamboo shoot dim sum served in a prawn shell ramen soup and choux pastry puffs filled with lavender creme patisserie and seasonal fruit coulis were all ethically and locally sourced. The judges loved it.

Both teams planned and executed their meal for two perfectly cooking alongside eight other teams in a realistically pressured environment like that associated with the dynamics of a professional kitchen.

The much-anticipated final announcement of the evening was that of Rotary Club of Bishop's Stortford Young Chef of the year 2023. We were all thrilled to congratulate Rosie on this achievement and gaining the title Young Chef of the Year. Rosie was recognised for her organisation, knowledge, technique, creativity, tenacity and encouragement of her team.

Congratulations to Christiaan, Mateusz, David, Rosie, Evie, Jessica who all represented our school with pride and produced some amazing outcomes.

I would like to give a special thank you to Miss. Delamain for all her hard work in the planning and preparation of the teams for this trip and to the families who have supported the home cooking practice that made this event so memorable.
