

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What's going on in DT?

Year 10 GCSE Design Technology: Product Design

This half term Year 10 product designers have finalised preparations for their Non-Exam Assessment (NEA) with a prototyping project focused on developing design skills for different clients and users.

This project challenged them to remove themselves from considering their own product requirements and to step into the lives of a user with a neurodevelopment disorder, learning disability or physical difficulty.



Through a range of research strategies students discovered previously unconsidered limitations associated with performing everyday actions e.g. eating or controlling electronic devices that influenced their designs while giving them a deeper appreciation of the difficulties some users face when negotiating everyday tasks.



Using the practical skills developed through previous projects students were tasked with realising their designs to create a high-quality prototype out of foam and card that would allow for high quality testing and future development.

The originality of the designs was excellent with many students creating completely new features to assist with the challenges discovered through research.

These included new way of picking up a dropped device for people with limited dexterity, a hands-free solution to eating if you are blind, a multi directional device for teeth cleaning specifically for the elderly and an adjustable modular approach to operating a television for someone with leaning difficulties.





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Year 6 Induction Day

We welcomed 186 new students to our St. Mary's family on Thursday, when they joined us for their Induction Day.

The day began with a welcome from Mr Johnston and Ms Conquest (Year 7 Learning Coordinator), who reminded our new students of our values of Love, Respect and Flourish. The students had time to experience taster lessons such as creative writing in English, and a rainbow fizz experiment in Science. The day ended with hymn practice and a Liturgy reflecting on how we must use our talents to be the very best we can be. The Year 6 students were exemplary, and we look forward to seeing them in their new St Mary's uniform in September.

All students should keep up their reading habit over the summer break. Please encourage your child to take part in the **Summer Reading Challenge**. They can collect a form from their English / AR teacher or from the library and receive five house points for reading two books over the holidays.



This year we are challenging all students to read two books over the summer break, for a chance to win five house points in September. The reading challenge was launched in assemblies last week and details are available from English teachers, AR teachers and the librarian.

Students read two books of their choice, they write a short review of each, and (for Year 7 and Year 8) do the book quiz on Accelerated Reader in September.

For KS3 students we have prepared a list of recommended titles, with the books listed according to their AR colours, but children do not have to choose from these suggestions. The important thing is for them to keep reading over the summer holiday, not just to maintain skill levels, but for their mental health and wellbeing.

Any books borrowed now from the library are due for return on 5th September, so please encourage your children to choose two books they will love to read over the break.
