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
## **Get (back) in the Reading Habit!**


The message to our students, across English and Accelerated Reader lessons, at the start of a new term is to **get reading.** 


Please encourage your child to read for 35 minutes each day, especially if they have got out of the habit over the summer break. Students should choose something they really enjoy to read – this might be fiction or non-fiction, a magazine or a graphic novel. Regular reading for pleasure increases students' performance across all subjects, and it's also great for their wellbeing during the busy start of term.


All students are expected to have a reading book in their bag every day.

Remind your child that they can visit the library (H4) to choose a book, especially if they feel like trying a new genre or author. Mrs Frino (librarian) and our student librarians are always on hand to help with choosing.









Books on display on the library desk for the first two weeks of term are all about returning to or starting school, fitting in and finding friends and interests.

Accelerated Reader teachers will also be relaunching reading incentives specifically for KS3 over the next fortnight. These include house points for every book quiz passed, the Reading Challenge Cup and certificates. They all aim to reward regular reading, regardless of the length of the book, and to make sure students continually improve their reading skills.

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## **Book Buzz ~ Year 7**


#### Book Buzz - a free book for every Year 7 student














## **Summer Reading Challenge**


