Harry Potter Book Day takes place on Thursday 12th October.


To join our special event after school, students should **sign up with Ms Keane or Mrs Frino**.



# Mr Diggory Assistant Headteacher/Teacher of English



Hello! My name is James Diggory and I am one of the new Assistant Headteachers here as St Mary's. I studied English at Exeter University before completing my teacher training at Cambridge University.
