Celebrating a Successful First Half Term!

October half-term began at 3.15pm this afternoon! It's been a fabulous first half term of the academic year—welcoming our new Year 7 students, and students into Year 12 after celebrating their excellent achievement at GCSE last summer. The data from the summer exams has now been published online and I am very pleased that the school has been recognised as being significantly 'Above Average'

based on national figures.

Indeed, **Progress** our Score measure of how much progress our students make from KS2 to the GCSE examination results means our students have made almost half a grade better progress than students nationally!

Last week, our Sixth Form team, led by Mr Noble, sent out 11 applications to Oxford and Cambridge Universities and another application for Medicine, which demonstrates the drive, ambition and excellent standards being set by our Year 13 students.

The Year 7 students ended their half term with a celebration assembly during which they were given their lapel badge for achieving the St. Mary's Summer Challenge Award. 'Bake Off' winners also got certificates and vouchers.

October is the month of the Holy Rosary and the whole school prayed together this morning in form time. Dedications were chosen by students and it proved to be a special moment of calm reflection.

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Anti-Bullying in School

St Mary's is unequivocal in its opposition to intimidating behaviour of any kind and will adopt a positive, whole school approach to confront such behaviour when in occurs.

The School believes that intimidation is best dealt with openly, by discussion with all parties being fully involved.

The School urges all pupils who feel they are the victims of bullying, peer-on-peer abuse, assault or intimidation to report their worries or concerns to an appropriate person, so that the problem can be identified and brought out into the open and dealt with appropriately.

The victim may report to:

- a fellow pupil who can go to a member of staff;
- a form tutor, their Learning Coordinator or an Assistant Headteacher;
- any other trusted member of staff—teaching or non-teaching;



Growing up in a small Welsh town in the Severn Valley meant big changes when I went to Lancaster University to study biochemistry with genetics and organic chemistry. I really enjoyed the opportunity they gave us to get into a classroom in a secondary school in my second year there, from that point I was hooked on being a teacher. I went on to study my PGCE at the University of Chester.

My real teaching career then started in Bishop's Stortford (a town I had never heard of or been anywhere near) at The Bishop's Stortford High School. I started teaching there in 2008. 


